This study suggested a profit motive in deciding drug dosing in end-stage kidney disease patient The researchers included adult Medicare eligible end-stage renal disease patients receiving in-center hemodialysis during November and December 2004 Regression models were used to estimate the mean epoetin dose and dose adjustment by profit,
